#### Writing

It can be seen from the chart above that disadvantaged children are performing in line with or above those children who are not from disadvantaged backgrounds. Similarly, the same can be said for progress in reading.

#### Reading

In reading, the disadvantaged children in classes years 2, 3, 5 and 6 have achieved in line with or better than those children who are not from disadvantaged backgrounds. In years 1 and 4, it can be seen that disadvantaged children are achieving below the level of those who are not from disadvantaged backgrounds. Similarly, in terms of progress year 5 children who are disadvantaged made slower progress than their non-disadvantaged counterparts.

#### Maths

In maths, all disadvantaged children have made progress and in key 2 all groups of disadvantaged children are achieving in line with their peers.

## Rationale for expenditure financial year April 2018 to April 2019 – see expenditure list 2018/19

Interventions will be set up for reading in year 1, 4 and 5. These interventions will be additional to the reading that the children already get in the class time. These children will be in years 2, 5 and 6 in the Autumn/Spring term 2018/19.

Further interventions will be set up in maths for disadvantaged children in years 1 and 2 in the summer term – these children will be in year 2 and 3 in the Autumn and Spring term 2018/19. Part of the PPG will be used to pay for TAs to come out of class and run the interventions.

As a school, we will continue to fund breakfast and after school clubs and school trips/visits. For a more detailed breakdown of expenditure see attached list. We buy in a music specialist who works with all children from nursery to year 6 and we have spent 42% of this expenditure from our Pupil Premium funding stream.

All of the year 6 children receive free after school tuition, our Nursery and Reception class have extra adults as 50% of children in early years come from disadvantaged backgrounds. Similarly, many children in early years enter school with underdeveloped speech and language skills so we spend some of the grant on extra therapy for those children, many of whom come from disadvantaged backgrounds.
